All applicants interested in the LPN to RN Articulation into the second year of the Associate Degree Nursing program must meet in person with a Carl Sandburg College Nursing Advisor prior to applying to the program. Be sure to make an appointment early in the process. Complete **Steps 1-3** prior to making an appointment with a Nursing Advisor.

- 1. If you have never attended Carl Sandburg College, complete an application for general admission to the College **Steps-to-enroll** and, if desired, apply for financial aid.
- 2. Send an official high school transcript or equivalent and any appropriate post-secondary educational institutions transcripts to the Admissions and Records Office.
- 3. Complete the college placement exam, if applicable.
- 4. Schedule an appointment and meet with a nursing advisor prior to applying.
- 5. Schedule and take the TEAS pre-admission exam. We recommend that you purchase the TEAS study guidebook and review prior to taking the TEAS exam. You may take the TEAS exam before or after submitting the online program application. However, you must complete the TEAS exam by the March 1 application deadline date to meet program selection criteria. You cannot take the TEAS exam more than three times in a twelve- month period. **TEAS exam scores are valid for two years.**
- 6. Complete **Steps 1-4** prior to completing the nursing program's online application. Complete the ONLINE Nursing Application and submit October 1 - March 1.
- 7. After submitting the online nursing program application, you need to pay the \$50.00 application fee to the Carl Sandburg College Business Office. The \$50.00 application fee is non-refundable. We will not review your application for admission into the nursing program until you have paid the application fee. You need to obtain the application fee form from your advisor.

All applicants must meet the following nursing program admission criteria for selection review:

- 8. Licensed Practical Nurse with an active Illinois license in good standing.
- 9. TEAS Adjusted Individual Score (AIS) cumulative score of 60% or higher.
- 10. All of the following courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher prior to entering the second year of the he Associate Degree Nursing Program:
  - ENG 101-Freshman Composition I
  - BIO 211 – Anatomy & Physiology I
  - BIO 212 – Anatomy & Physiology II
  - SOC 101 – Introduction to Sociology
  - NAD 108 – Health Assessment & Clinical Reasoning
  - NAD 180 – LPN to RN Transitions
  - PSY 101-Introduction to Psychology
  - NUT 110 – Nutrition
  - BIO 200 – General Microbiology
  - NAD 106 – Medication Principles for Nurses
  - NAD 130 – Pharmacology for Nurses

Only those admitted into the program can take NAD 180 LPN to RN Transitions course during the summer semester prior to starting the second year of the Associate Degree Nursing program.

- 11. Completed and signed Program Application Checklist on file in the College of Nursing & Health Professions Office by application deadline date of March 1.

**Meeting all eligibility criteria for selection does not guarantee admission to the Associate Degree Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and enrollment is limited. Final selection based on applicant pool and ranking point system. Applicants selected are notified approximately two weeks after the application deadline date.**
