## ILLINOIS ARTICULATION INITIATIVE – IAI

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General education is the starting point for your transfer destination. Whether you're pursuing an associate's degree (60 or more semester hours) or a bachelor's degree (120 or more credits), you'll need to take a set of core courses considered an essential foundation for a well-rounded education. The IAI General Education Curriculum (GECC) consists of a set of 12 to 13 courses (37 to 41 credits). Successful completion of these core courses at any participating college or university in the state of Illinois will facilitate transfer to any other participating associate or bachelor degree program.

The Associate of Arts (AA) incorporates the IAI General Education Core Curriculum (GECC). This degree ensures the transfer of courses to a college or university that participates in the statewide IAI. Upon transfer, students with the degree will have met lower level general education requirements and attain junior class status. No more than one course with the same IAI number (shown in parentheses) can be selected to satisfy the minimum requirements in each general education category. Since some college majors require certain general education courses, students should always consult with a Sandburg advisor.

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## NOTES

Acceptance of a "D" grade and non-traditional credit such as (CLEP, AP, military service, proficiency exam) varies from institution to institution.

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
